## Psalm 73 Quam bonus Israel!

- 1 Truly, God is good to Israel, \* to those who are pure in heart.
- 2 But as for me, my feet had nearly slipped; \* I had almost tripped and fallen;
- 3 Because I envied the proud \* and saw the prosperity of the wicked:
- 4 For they suffer no pain, \* and their bodies are sleek and sound;
- 5 In the misfortunes of others they have no share; \* they are not afflicted as others are;

- 6 Therefore they wear their pride like a necklace \* and wrap their violence about them like a cloak.
- 7 Their iniquity comes from gross minds, \* and their hearts overflow with wicked thoughts.
- 8 They scoff and speak maliciously; \* out of their haughtiness they plan oppression.
- 9 They set their mouths against the heavens, \* and their evil speech runs through the world.
- 10 And so the people turn to them \* and find in them no fault.
- 11 They say, "How should God know? \* is there knowledge in the Most High?"
- 12 So then, these are the wicked; \* always at ease, they increase their wealth.
- 13 In vain have I kept my heart clean, \* and washed my hands in innocence.
- 14 I have been afflicted all day long, \* and punished every morning.
- 15 Had I gone on speaking this way, \*
  I should have betrayed the generation of your children.
- 16 When I tried to understand these things, \* it was too hard for me;
- 17 Until I entered the sanctuary of God \* and discerned the end of the wicked.
- 18 Surely, you set them in slippery places; \* you cast them down in ruin.

- 19 Oh, how suddenly do they come to destruction, \* come to an end, and perish from terror!
- 20 Like a dream when one awakens, O Lord, \* when you arise you will make their image vanish.
- 21 When my mind became embittered, \* I was sorely wounded in my heart.
- 22 I was stupid and had no understanding; \* I was like a brute beast in your presence.
- 23 Yet I am always with you; \* you hold me by my right hand.
- 24 You will guide me by your counsel, \* and afterwards receive me with glory.
- 25 Whom have I in heaven but you? \* and having you I desire nothing upon earth.
- 26 Though my flesh and my heart should waste away, \* God is the strength of my heart and my portion for ever.
- 27 Truly, those who forsake you will perish; \* you destroy all who are unfaithful.
- 28 But it is good for me to be near God; \* I have made the Lord GOD my refuge.
- 29 I will speak of all your works \* in the gates of the city of Zion.

## The Lessons

A Reading from the Book of Judges Chapter 5 verses 1 through 18

- 5 Then sang Deb'orah and Barak the son of Abin'o-am on that day:
- <sup>2</sup> "That the leaders took the lead in Israel, that the people offered themselves willingly, bless<sup>[a]</sup> the LORD!
- <sup>3</sup> "Hear, O kings; give ear, O princes; to the LORD I will sing,

I will make melody to the LORD, the God of Israel.

<sup>4</sup> "LORD, when thou didst go forth from Se'ir, when thou didst march from the region of Edom, the earth trembled,

and the heavens dropped, yea, the clouds dropped water.

- <sup>5</sup> The mountains quaked before the LORD, yon Sinai before the LORD, the God of Israel.
- <sup>6</sup> "In the days of Shamgar, son of Anath, in the days of Ja'el, caravans ceased and travelers kept to the byways.
- <sup>7</sup> The peasantry ceased in Israel, they ceased until you arose, Deb'orah, arose as a mother in Israel.
- <sup>8</sup> When new gods were chosen, then war was in the gates.

Was shield or spear to be seen among forty thousand in Israel?

- <sup>9</sup> My heart goes out to the commanders of Israel who offered themselves willingly among the people. Bless the LORD.
- <sup>10</sup> "Tell of it, you who ride on tawny asses, you who sit on rich carpets<sup>[b]</sup> and you who walk by the way.
- <sup>11</sup> To the sound of musicians<sup>[c]</sup> at the watering places, there they repeat the triumphs of the LORD, the triumphs of his peasantry in Israel.
- "Then down to the gates marched the people of the LORD.
- 12 "Awake, awake, Deb'orah! Awake, awake, utter a song!

Arise, Barak, lead away your captives,

O son of Abin'o-am.

<sup>13</sup> Then down marched the remnant of the noble;

the people of the LORD marched down for him<sup>[d]</sup> against the mighty.

<sup>14</sup> From E'phraim they set out thither [e] into the valley, [f]

following you, Benjamin, with your kinsmen;

from Machir marched down the commanders,

and from Zeb'ulun those who bear the marshal's staff;

15 the princes of Is'sachar came with Deb'orah,

and Is'sachar faithful to Barak;

into the valley they rushed forth at his heels.

<sup>16</sup> Why did you tarry among the sheepfolds,

to hear the piping for the flocks?

Among the clans of Reuben

there were great searchings of heart.

Asher sat still at the coast of the sea,

settling down by his landings.

<sup>18</sup> Zeb'ulun is a people that jeoparded their lives to the death;

Naph'tali too, on the heights of the field.

28 Now after the sabbath, toward the dawn of the first day of the week, Mary Mag'dalene and the other Mary went to see the sepulchre. <sup>2</sup> And behold, there was a great earthquake; for an angel of the Lord descended from heaven and came and rolled back the stone, and sat upon it. <sup>3</sup> His appearance was like lightning, and his raiment white as snow. <sup>4</sup> And for fear of him the guards trembled and became like dead men. <sup>5</sup> But the angel said to the women, "Do not be afraid; for I know that you seek Jesus who was crucified. <sup>6</sup> He is not here; for he has risen, as he said. Come, see the place where he<sup>[a]</sup> lay. <sup>7</sup> Then go quickly and tell his disciples that he has risen from the dead, and behold, he is going before you to Galilee; there you will see him. Lo, I have told you." <sup>8</sup> So they departed quickly from the tomb with fear and great joy, and ran to tell his disciples. <sup>9</sup> And behold, Jesus met them and said, "Hail!" And they came up and took hold of his feet and worshiped him. <sup>10</sup> Then Jesus said to them, "Do not be afraid; go and tell my brethren to go to Galilee, and there they will see me."

#### A Collect for Mission on p. 70

O God and Father of all, whom the whole heavens adore: Let the whole earth also worship thee, all nations obey thee, all tongues confess and bless thee, and men and women everywhere love thee and serve thee in peace; through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen*.

#### A Collect for the Unity of the Human Family

O God, thou hast made us in thine own image and redeemed us through thy Son Jesus Christ, the Prince of Peace: Give us grace

seriously to lay to heart the great dangers we are in by our unhappy and unjust divisions; look with compassion on the whole human family; take away the arrogance and hatred which infect our hearts; break down the walls that separate us; and work through our struggles and confusion to accomplish thy purposes on earth; that we may be united in one holy bond of truth, and justice, peace, and love; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.
