### The Invitatory and Psalter

*Officiant* O Lord, open thou our lips.

*People* And our mouth shall show forth thy praise.

*Officiant and People*

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit:  
as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be for ever. Amen. Alleluia.

*Officiant* Worship the Lord in the beauty of holiness.

*People* O come, let us adore him.

### **Venite** *Psalms 95:1-7*

O come, let us sing unto the Lord; \*

let us heartily rejoice in the strength of our salvation.

Let us come before his presence with thanksgiving \*

and show ourselves glad in him with psalms.

For the Lord is a great God, \*

and a great King above all gods.

In his hand are all the corners of the earth, \*

and the strength of the hills is his also.

The sea is his, and he made it, \*

and his hands prepared the dry land.

O come, let us worship and fall down, \*

and kneel before the Lord our Maker.

For he is the Lord our God, \*

and we are the people of his pasture

and the sheep of his hand.

O worship the Lord in the beauty of holiness; \*

let the whole earth stand in awe of him.

For he cometh, for he cometh to judge the earth, \*

and with righteousness to judge the world

and the peoples with his truth.

**Psalm 121**     *Levavi oculos*

- I lift up my eyes to the hills; \*  
1     from where is my help to come?
- 2 My help comes from the LORD, \*  
   the maker of heaven and earth.
- 3 He will not let your foot be moved \*  
   and he who watches over you will not fall asleep.
- 4 Behold, he who keeps watch over Israel \*  
   shall neither slumber nor sleep;
- 5 The LORD himself watches over you; \*  
   the LORD is your shade at your right hand,
- 6 So that the sun shall not strike you by day, \*  
   nor the moon by night.
- 7 The LORD shall preserve you from all evil; \*  
   it is he who shall keep you safe.
- 8 The LORD shall watch over your going out and  
   your coming in, \*  
   from this time forth for evermore.

**Psalm 122**     *Lætatus sum*

- I was glad when they said to me, \*  
1     "Let us go to the house of the LORD."
- 2 Now our feet are standing \*  
   within your gates, O Jerusalem.
- 3 Jerusalem is built as a city \*  
   that is at unity with itself;
- 4 To which the tribes go up,  
   the tribes of the LORD, \*

the assembly of Israel,  
to praise the Name of the LORD.

5 For there are the thrones of judgment, \*  
the thrones of the house of David.

6 Pray for the peace of Jerusalem: \*  
"May they prosper who love you.

7 Peace be within your walls \*  
and quietness within your towers.

8 For my brethren and companions' sake, \*  
I pray for your prosperity.

9 Because of the house of the LORD our God, \*  
I will seek to do you good."

**Psalm 123**     *Ad te levavi oculos meos*

1 To you I lift up my eyes, \*  
to you enthroned in the heavens.

2 As the eyes of servants look to the hand of their masters, \*  
and the eyes of a maid to the hand of her mistress,

3 So our eyes look to the LORD our God, \*  
until he show us his mercy.

4 Have mercy upon us, O LORD, have mercy, \*  
for we have had more than enough of contempt,

5 Too much of the scorn of the indolent rich, \*  
and of the derision of the proud.

## The Lesson

*Officiant*        A Reading from the First Letter of Paul to the Corinthians  
                            *Chapter 3 verses 10 through 23*

<sup>10</sup> According to the grace of God given to me, like a skilled master builder I laid a foundation, and another man is building upon it. Let each man take care how he builds upon it. <sup>11</sup> For no other foundation can any one lay than that which is laid, which is Jesus Christ. <sup>12</sup> Now if any one builds on the foundation with gold, silver, precious stones, wood, hay, straw— <sup>13</sup> each man's work will become manifest; for the Day will disclose it, because it will be revealed with fire, and the fire will test what sort of work each one has done. <sup>14</sup> If the work which any man has built on the foundation survives, he will receive a reward. <sup>15</sup> If any man's work is burned up, he will suffer loss, though he himself will be saved, but only as through fire. <sup>16</sup> Do you not know that you are God's temple and that God's Spirit dwells in you? <sup>17</sup> If any one destroys God's temple, God will destroy him. For God's temple is holy, and that temple you are. <sup>18</sup> Let no one deceive himself. If any one among you thinks that he is wise in this age, let him become a fool that he may become wise. <sup>19</sup> For the wisdom of this world is folly with God. For it is written, "He catches the wise in their craftiness," <sup>20</sup> and again, "The Lord knows that the thoughts of the wise are futile." <sup>21</sup> So let no one boast of men. For all things are yours, <sup>22</sup> whether Paul or Apol'los or Cephas or the world or life or death or the present or the future, all are yours; <sup>23</sup> and you are Christ's; and Christ is God's.

## 4 The Song of Zechariah    *Benedictus Dominus Deus*

through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*

A Collect for Mission on p. 57

Almighty and everlasting God, by whose Spirit the whole  
body of thy faithful people is governed and sanctified:  
Receive our supplications and prayers which we offer before  
thee for all members of thy holy Church, that in their  
vocation and ministry they may truly and godly serve thee;  
through our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. *Amen.*

A Collect for the Unity of the Human Family

O God, thou hast made us in thine own image and redeemed us  
through thy Son Jesus Christ, the Prince of Peace: Give us grace  
seriously to lay to heart the great dangers we are in by our unhappy  
and unjust divisions; look with compassion on the whole human

break down the walls that separate us; and work through our struggles  
and confusion to accomplish thy purposes on earth; that we may be  
united in one holy bond of truth, and justice, peace, and love;  
through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*
