The Invitatory and Psalter

Officiant and People

Psalm 105: Part II *Et intravit Israel*

23 Israel came into Egypt, *
and Jacob became a sojourner in the land of Ham.

24 The LORD made his people exceedingly fruitful; *
he made them stronger than their enemies;

25 Whose heart he turned, so that they hated his people, *
and dealt unjustly with his servants.

26 He sent Moses his servant, *
and Aaron whom he had chosen.

but the Egyptians rebelled against his words.
- 29 He turned their waters into blood *

- 34 He spoke, and the locust came, *
and young locusts without number,
- 35 Which ate up all the green plants in their land *
and devoured the fruit of their soil.
- 36 He struck down the firstborn of their land, *
the firstfruits of all their strength.
- 37 He led out his people with silver and gold; *
in all their tribes there was not one that stumbled.
- 38 Egypt was glad of their going, *
because they were afraid of them.
- 39 He spread out a cloud for a covering *
and a fire to give light in the night season.
- 40 They asked, and quails appeared, *
and he satisfied them with bread from heaven.

- 41 He opened the rock, and water flowed, *
so the river ran in the dry places.
- 42 For God remembered his holy word *
and Abraham his servant.
- 43 So he led forth his people with gladness, *
his chosen with shouts of joy.
- 44 He gave his people the lands of the nations, *
and they took the fruit of others' toil,
- 45 That they might keep his statutes *
and observe his laws.

The Lessons

Officiant A Reading from the Book of Hosea
Chapter 5 verse 8 through Chapter 6 verse 6

- ⁸ Blow the horn in Gib'e-ah,
the trumpet in Ramah.
Sound the alarm at Beth-a'ven;
tremble,^[c] O Benjamin!
- ⁹ E'phraim shall become a desolation
in the day of punishment;
among the tribes of Israel
I declare what is sure.
- ¹⁰ The princes of Judah have become
like those who remove the landmark;
upon them I will pour out
my wrath like water.
- ¹¹ E'phraim is oppressed, crushed in judgment,
because he was determined to go after vanity.^[d]
- ¹² Therefore I am like a moth to E'phraim,
and like dry rot to the house of Judah.

¹³ When E'phraim saw his sickness,
 and Judah his wound,
 then E'phraim went to Assyria,
 and sent to the great king.^[e]
 But he is not able to cure you
 or heal your wound.
¹⁴ For I will be like a lion to E'phraim,
 and like a young lion to the house of Judah.
 I, even I, will rend and go away,
 I will carry off, and none shall rescue.
¹⁵ I will return again to my place,
 until they acknowledge their guilt and seek my face,
 and in their distress they seek me, saying,
 "Come, let us return to the LORD;
 for he has torn, that he may heal us;
 he has stricken, and he will bind us up.
² After two days he will revive us;
 on the third day he will raise us up,
 that we may live before him.
³ Let us know, let us press on to know the LORD;
 his going forth is sure as the dawn;
 he will come to us as the showers,
 as the spring rains that water the earth."

Officiant A Reading from the Gospel of Luke
 Chapter 6 verses 1 through 11

6 On a sabbath,^[a] while he was going through the grainfields, his disciples plucked and ate some heads of grain, rubbing them in their hands. **2** But some of the Pharisees said, “Why are you doing what is not lawful to do on the sabbath?” **3** And Jesus answered, “Have you not read what David did when he was hungry, he and those who were with him: **4** how he entered the house of God, and took and ate the bread of the Presence, which it is not lawful for any but the priests to eat, and also gave it to those with him?” **5** And he said to them, “The Son of man is lord of the sabbath.”

6 On another sabbath, when he entered the synagogue and taught, a man was there whose right hand was withered. **7** And the scribes and the Pharisees watched him, to see whether he would heal on the sabbath, so that they might find an accusation against him. **8** But he knew their thoughts, and he said to the man who had the withered hand, “Come and stand here.” And he rose and stood there. **9** And Jesus said to them, “I ask you, is it lawful on the sabbath to do good or to do harm, to save life or to destroy it?” **10** And he looked around on them all, and said to him, “Stretch out your hand.” And he did so, and his hand was restored. **11** But they were filled with fury and discussed with one another what they might do to Jesus.

is past; be our companion in the way, kindle our hearts, and
awaken hope, that we may know thee as thou art revealed in
Scripture and the breaking of bread. Grant this for the sake
of thy love. *Amen.*

A Collect for Mission on p. 70

O God and Father of all, whom the whole heavens adore:
Let the whole earth also worship thee, all nations obey thee,
all tongues confess and bless thee, and men and women every-
where love thee and serve thee in peace; through Jesus Christ
our Lord. *Amen.*

A Collect for the Unity of the Human Family

O God, thou hast made us in thine own image and redeemed us
through thy Son Jesus Christ, the Prince of Peace: Give us grace
seriously to lay to heart the great dangers we are in by our unhappy
and unjust divisions; look with compassion on the whole human
family; take away the arrogance and hatred which infect our hearts;
break down the walls that separate us; and work through our struggles
and confusion to accomplish thy purposes on earth; that we may be
united in one holy bond of truth, and justice, peace, and love;
through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*
