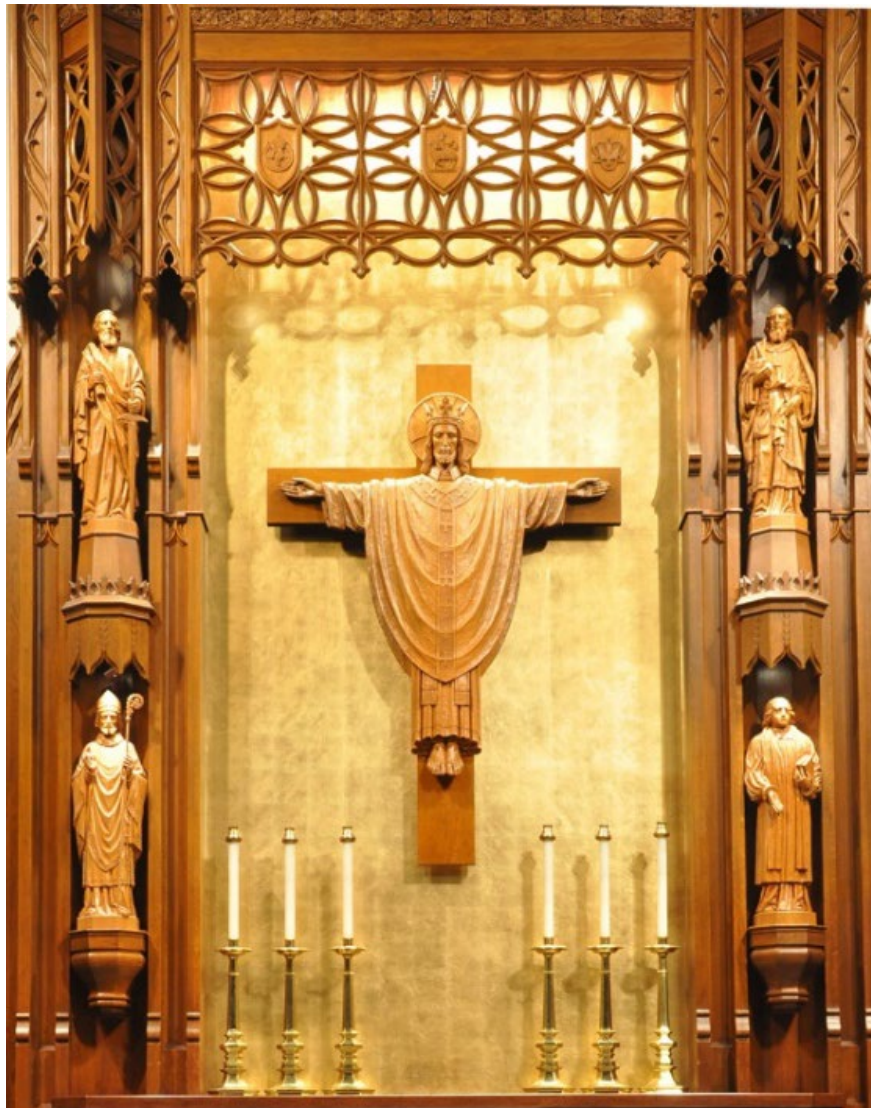

and the life everlasting. Amen.


