
## The Holy Gospel, Mark 9:2-9

Before the Gospel: Glory to you, Lord Christ

After six days Jesus took with him Peter and James and John, and led them up a high mountain apart by themselves; and he was transfigured before them, and his garments became glistening, intensely white, as no fuller on earth could bleach them. And there appeared to them Eli'jah with Moses; and they were talking to Jesus.
