### The Invitatory and Psalter

*Officiant* O Lord, open thou our lips.

*People* And our mouth shall show forth thy praise.

### **Venite** *Psalm 95:1-7*

O come, let us sing unto the Lord; \*

let us heartily rejoice in the strength of our salvation.

Let us come before his presence with thanksgiving \*

and show ourselves glad in him with psalms.

For the Lord is a great God, \*

and a great King above all gods.

In his hand are all the corners of the earth, \*

and the strength of the hills is his also.

The sea is his, and he made it, \*

and his hands prepared the dry land.

and kneel before the Lord our Maker.

and we are the people of his pasture

### **Psalm 107: Part II** *Posuit flumina*

33 The LORD changed rivers into deserts, \*

35 He changed deserts into pools of water \*  
and dry land into water-springs.

36 He settled the hungry there, \*  
and they founded a city to dwell in.

37 They sowed fields, and planted vineyards, \*  
and brought in a fruitful harvest.

38 He blessed them, so that they increased greatly; \*  
he did not let their herds decrease.

39 Yet when they were diminished and brought low, \*  
through stress of adversity and sorrow,

40 (He pours contempt on princes \*  
and makes them wander in trackless wastes)

41 He lifted up the poor out of misery \*  
and multiplied their families like flocks of sheep.

42 The upright will see this and rejoice, \*  
but all wickedness will shut its mouth.

43 Whoever is wise will ponder these things, \*  
and consider well the mercies of the LORD.

2 Wake up, my spirit;  
awake, lute and harp; \*  
I myself will waken the dawn.

I will sing praises to you among the nations.

- 4 For your loving-kindness is greater than the heavens, \*  
and your faithfulness reaches to the clouds.
- 5 Exalt yourself above the heavens, O God, \*  
and your glory over all the earth.
- 6 So that those who are dear to you may be delivered, \*  
save with your right hand and answer me.

## The Lesson

*Officiant*      A Reading from the Letter of Paul to the Romans  
*Chapter 9 verses 1 through 18*

I am speaking the truth in Christ, I am not lying; my conscience bears me witness in the Holy Spirit, that I have great sorrow and unceasing anguish in my heart. For I could wish that I myself were accursed and cut off from Christ for the sake of my brethren, my kinsmen by race. They are Israelites, and to them belong the sonship, the glory, the covenants, the giving of the law, the worship, and the promises; to them belong the patriarchs, and of their race, according to the flesh, is the Christ. God who is over all be blessed for ever. Amen. But it is not as though the word of God had failed. For not all who are descended from Israel belong to Israel, and not all are children of Abraham because they are his descendants; but "Through Isaac shall your descendants be named." This means that it is not the children of the flesh who are the children of God, but the children of the promise are reckoned as descendants. For this is what the promise said, "About this time I will return and Sarah shall have a son." And not only so, but also when Rebecca had conceived children by one man, our forefather Isaac, though they were not yet born and had done nothing either good or bad, in order that God's purpose of election might continue, not because of works but because of his call, she was told, "The elder will serve the younger." As it is written, "Jacob I loved, but Esau I hated." What shall we say then? Is there injustice on God's part? By no means! For he says to Moses, "I will have mercy on whom I have mercy, and I will have compassion on whom I have compassion." So it depends not upon man's will or exertion, but upon God's mercy. For the scripture says to Pharaoh, "I have raised you up for the very purpose of

showing my power in you, so that my name may be proclaimed in all the earth.” So then he has mercy upon whomever he wills, and he hardens the heart of whomever he wills.

**10 The Second Song of Isaiah**        *Quaerite Dominum*  
*Isaiah 55:6-11*

Seek the Lord while he wills to be found; \*  
    call upon him when he draws near.  
Let the wicked forsake their ways \*

And let them turn to the Lord, and he will have compassion, \*  
    and to our God, for he will richly pardon.  
For my thoughts are not your thoughts, \*

But it will accomplish that which I have purposed, \*  
    and prosper in that for which I sent it.

**A Collect for Mission on p. 58**

O God, who hast made of one blood all the peoples of the earth, and didst send thy blessed Son to preach peace to those who are far off and to those who are near: Grant that people everywhere may seek after thee and find thee; bring the nations into thy fold; pour out thy Spirit upon all flesh; and hasten the coming of thy kingdom; through the same thy Son Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*

**A Collect for the Unity of the Human Family**

O God, thou hast made us in thine own image and redeemed us through thy Son Jesus Christ, the Prince of Peace: Give us grace seriously to lay to heart the great dangers we are in by our unhappy and unjust divisions; look with compassion on the whole human family; take away the arrogance and hatred which infect our hearts; break down the walls that separate us; and work through our struggles and confusion to accomplish thy purposes on earth; that we may be united in one holy bond of truth, and justice, peace, and love; through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*
