- 7 He made his ways known to Moses* and his works to the children of Israel.
- 8 The LORD is full of compassion and mercy,* slow to anger and of great kindness.

 nor will he keep his anger for ever.
- 10 He has not dealt with us according to our sins,* nor rewarded us according to our wickedness.
- 11 For as the heavens are high above the earth,* so is his mercy great upon those who fear him.
- 12 As far as the east is from the west,*
 so far has he removed our sins from us.
- 13 As a father cares for his children,*
 so does the LORD care for those who fear him.
- 14 For he himself knows whereof we are made;* he remembers that we are but dust.
- 15 Our days are like the grass;* we flourish like a flower of the field;



- 16 When the wind goes over it, it is gone,* and its place shall know it no more.
- 17 But the merciful goodness of the LORD endures for ever on those **who** fear **him**,* and his righteousness on **children**'s **children**;
- 18 On those who keep **his** covenant* and remember his commandments and do them.
- 19 The LORD has set his throne in heaven,* and his kingship has dominion over all.
- 20 Bless the LORD, you angels of his, you mighty ones who do his bidding,* and hearken to the voice of his word.
- 21 Bless the LORD, all you his hosts,* you ministers of his who do his will.
- 22 Bless the LORD, all you works of his, in all places of his dominion;* bless the LORD, O my soul.

The First Lesson, Joshua 6:15-27

Revised Standard Version

On the seventh day they rose early at the dawn of day, and marched around the city in the same manner seven times: it was only on that day that they marched around the city seven times. And at the seventh time, when the priests had blown the trumpets, Joshua said to the people, "Shout; for the LORD has given you the city. ¹⁷ And the city and all that is within it shall be devoted to the LORD for destruction; only Rahab the harlot and all who are with her in her house shall live, because she hid the messengers that we sent. But you, keep yourselves from the things devoted to destruction, lest when you have devoted them you take any of the devoted things and make the camp of Israel a thing for destruction, and bring trouble upon it. But all silver and gold, and vessels of bronze and iron, are sacred to the LORD; they shall go into the treasury of the LORD." So the people shouted,

and the trumpets were blown. As soon as the people heard the sound of the trumpet, the people raised a great shout, and the wall fell down flat, so that the people went up into the city, every man straight before him, and they took the city. Then they utterly destroyed all in the city, both men and women, young and old, oxen, sheep, and asses, with the edge of the sword.

And Joshua said to the two men who had spied out the land, "Go into the harlot's house, and bring out from it the woman, and all who belong to her, as you swore to her." So the young men who had been spies went in, and brought out Rahab, and her father and mother and brothers and all who belonged to her; and they brought all her kindred, and set them outside the camp of Israel. And they burned the city with fire, and all within it; only the silver and gold, and the vessels of bronze and of iron, they put into the treasury of the house of the LORD. But Rahab the harlot, and her father's household, and all who belonged to her, Joshua saved alive; and she dwelt in Israel to this day, because she hid the messengers whom Joshua sent to spy out Jericho.

Joshua laid an oath upon them at that time, saying, "Cursed before the LORD be the man that rises up and rebuilds this city, Jericho.

At the cost of his first-born shall he lay its foundation, and at the cost of his youngest son shall he set up its gates."


So the LORD was with Joshua; and his fame was in all the land.

Plainsong, Tone 8







And when they could not get near him because of the crowd, they removed the roof above him; and when they had made an opening, they let down the pallet on which the paralytic lay. And when Jesus saw their faith, he said to the paralytic, "My son, your sins are forgiven." Now some of the scribes were sitting there, questioning in their hearts, "Why does this man speak thus? It is blasphemy! Who can forgive sins but God alone?" And immediately Jesus, perceiving in his spirit that they thus questioned within themselves, said to them, "Why do you question thus in your hearts? Which is easier, to say to the paralytic, 'Your sins are forgiven,' or to say, 'Rise, take up your pallet and walk'? But that you may know that the Son of man has authority on earth to forgive sins"—he said to the paralytic — "I say to you, rise, take up your pallet and go home." And he rose, and immediately took up the pallet and went out before them all; so that they were all amazed and glorified God, saying, "We never saw anything like this!"





A Collect for Sundays






The General Thanksgiving
